

Harries brothers tragedy

We Remember the three Harries Brothers from Newport, Pembrokeshire who were all lost at sea during the war.

The newspaper article is dated December 3rd 1942. The Third Son mentioned in the story who was reported missing at the time was already dead, but this was not confirmed until later.

The ships that they were lost from were:

HOWARD LEVY HARRIES

Age 25. Chief Steward, lost in the **S.S. British Monarch** sunk 19th June 1940. Son of Mrs. A. Harries, of Newport, Pembrokeshire.

DAVID GLYN HARRIES

Age 25. Third Officer, lost in the **S.S. Empire Stream** sunk 25th September 1941. Son of Mrs. A. Harries, of Newport, Pembrokeshire.

KENNETH GEORGE HARRIES

Age 21. Third Engineer, lost in the **S.S. Garlinge** sunk 10th November 1942. Son of Mrs. A. Harries, of Newport, Pembrokeshire.

NEWPORT FAMILY'S GREAT ANXIETY.

Great anxiety is felt by all the inhabitants of Newport, Pem., concerning the safety of Engineer Kenneth Harries, the youngest son of Mrs Harries, Hill Crest, St. Mary Street, Newport, on hearing the tragic news that the young sailor was missing.

It was reported in our last week's issue that Mr Harries's ship had been sunk by enemy action.

War has brought grievous tidings to Mrs Harries during the past three years. Two of her sons having made the supreme sacrifice. Early in 1940 Mr Howard Harries lost his life, then in September 1941 Mr Glyn Harries was lost and now, another terrible blow, Mr Kenneth Harries is reported missing.
